	a.	A single wrong decision can lead us into horrible sin. Read the first paragraph on page 161; what was David's wrong decision?		
	b.	What is the big deal about Bathsheba being the wife of Uriah the Hittite? He is listed as one of David's men; you can read about them in 2 Samuel 23:8-39.		
	C.	Whenever we sin God invites us to confess and receive His forgiveness.		
		i. What did David do after he sinned?		
		ii. Was David successful? Y N		
		iii. How did David go from bad to worse?		
	d.	Why was Nathan very courageous in going to David?		
	e.	Even though David received God's forgiveness, he would endure many consequences of his sin during his earthly life.		
	f.	What most famous <i>Psalm of confession</i> did David write?		
	g.	Notice the basics of Psalm 32 (page 165): Being forgiven is wonderful: vvs. 1-2; failing to confess is terrible: vvs. 3-4; the blessings of confession and absolution: v. 5.		
	h.	David had many sons (1 Chr. 3:1-9); his third-born, Absalom, tried to take David's position as king; then, against David's orders, he was finally put to death.		
	i.	David wanted to build a house for the LORD, but that project fell to his son; that son eventually built the temple, but the LORD also promised to establish another son of David, a future Son, whose throne over Israel would be established forever!		
	j.	Since David was not permitted to build the temple, he did gather a large quantity of expensive building materials.

Chapter 13: The King Who Had It All

- 2. <u>Chapter 13 Highlights</u>: This chapter includes Solomon's great wisdom and his building of the first temple.
 - a. Note the timeline at the bottom of page 175.
 - b. These are some of the final words David spoke to Solomon: NAS 1 Chronicles 28:9 "As for you, my son Solomon,
 - i. know the God of your father, and
 - ii. serve Him with a whole heart and a willing mind;
 - iii. for the LORD searches all hearts, and understands every intent of the thoughts.
 - iv. If you seek Him, He will let you find Him;
 - v. but if you forsake Him, He will reject you forever."
 - c. Solomon's wisdom:
 - i. Since Solomon asked for wisdom, the LORD also gave him great wealth and honor. Let us also ask rightly of our God!
 - ii. Solomon demonstrated his great wisdom when the two women were arguing about the one living child; how did he identify the mother of the living child?

- iii. Let's skim over the excerpts from the book of Proverbs on pages 179-183.
- d. Solomon's temple:
 - i. Take note that the footprint was only 90 feet by 30 feet, but it was so spectacular and elaborate that its "construction took seven years of work by 180,000 conscripted [enlisted, recruited, drafted] laborers and nearly 4,000 supervisors" (185).
 - ii. The LORD approved of the temple by filling it with His glory (186).
 - iii. Then Solomon prayed: "LORD, the God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth below you who keep your covenant of love with your servants who continue wholeheartedly in your way" (186). Let us do the same!
 - iv. Then "fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices..." (187).
