Q Quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry. (James 1:19)

As sinful human beings our tendencies can be the opposite of this verse, so let us: Listen before answering, choose our words carefully, and do not be easily angered. God's ways are for our benefit!

R -> Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. (Exodus 20:8)

This is the third commandment. The OT Sabbath of Saturday rest pointed ahead to Jesus, our rest! Now, in the NT, we focus on Sunday, the Lord's Day, when Jesus rose from the dead! God wants us to gather and receive his blessings each week!

S -> Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness. (Matthew 6:33)

For many their lives are consumed by their pursuit of food, clothing, and shelter, but God calls us first to be members of His kingdom and righteous in His sight – both through faith in Jesus! For all who put Him first, God promises to provide every need!

T → Trust in the LORD with all your heart.

(Proverbs 3:5)

To trust with our "heart" means to trust with our entire being? Then we will have confidence in His promises and His peace in every circumstance!

U → Understand that the universe was formed at God's command. (Hebrews 11:3)

God is so awesome that He simply spoke creation into existence! Look at the facts; they strongly point to creation, not to evolution. God made us sinless; then we sinned; now we all need Jesus; through Him we are blessed now and forever!

V → Victory rests with the LORD.

(Proverbs 21:31)

What battles are you currently fighting? In whom is your trust for help, strength, and victory? Let us trust in the Lord; He will give us the victory!

W → Walk as Jesus did.

(1 John 2:6)

We cannot live without sin, so Jesus did that for us! But, forgiven through Jesus and powered by the Holy Spirit, we can speak the truth in love and take action to love others in Jesus' name!

X → Excel in gifts that build up the church.

(1 Corinthians 14:12)

The church is not a religion or a building, but all who trust in Jesus as Savior! We build up such people by teaching them the Bible. They benefit when they understand it, live it, and, finally, share it with others! Parents: Teach your children!

Y > You are the light of the world.

(Matthew 5:14)

Jesus is the true light of the world, but we, His followers, are called to reflect His light – His truth and love – to the world! As the moon reflects the sun, so Christians reflect Jesus to others!

Z Zion will be redeemed with justice.

(Isaiah 1:27)

God the Father is the Redeemer; He purchased us (Zion) with the precious blood of Jesus. God did not overlook our sins; instead, He punished Jesus for them. *Now, through Jesus, we are redeemed!*

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
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A Special Blessing For Parents and Children!

Memorize the Verses! Be Blessed by Their Meanings!

The Bible is God's Holy Word! It has been written for our temporal and eternal benefit. Here are some examples:

- Spiritual Birth: "He chose to give us birth through the word of truth ..." (NIV James 1:18)
- Eternal Life: "... these [words of John's Gospel] are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (NIV John 20:31)
- Christian Living: "All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (NIV 2 Timothy 3:16-17)

A → All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)

What is the "glory of God"? To live without sin; BUT all have fallen short! Imagine the need to cross a 40 foot canyon to get to heaven. Some could jump 10 or 20 feet, the world record is 29.4 feet, but no one could jump 40 feet. Without Jesus we can never get to heaven!

B → Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved. (Acts 16:31)

Since we have fallen short, Jesus lived a sinless life for us. Then, on the cross, He received our sins and our punishment. Now, believing in Jesus as our Savior, our sins are forgiven and we are saved!

C → Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. (Colossians 3:20)

Because the Lord has saved us from our sins and promised us a place in heaven, we are filled with joy and desire to *know* and *do* His will. That includes children obeying their parents, *who are God's visible representatives in their lives!*

D → Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:21)

Even Christians are tempted to get revenge. But, as God's forgiven children through Jesus, we try to honor the Lord by doing good to all people – even to those who do evil against us!

E → Even a child is known by his actions.

(Proverbs 20:11)

We know the phrase: Actions speak louder than words! If we claim to be Christians, but live like the world, people will see that our words are not true. So let us *be sorry for our sins, *rejoice in our Savior, and *honor Him in all we do!

F → Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. (Luke 11:4)

This verse is from Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer; see Matthew 6:9-13 for the full version. As God has *freely* and *fully* forgiven us in Christ, God calls us to extend that same *free* and *full* forgiveness to *all* who sin against us!

G → God is love.

(1 John 4:8)

God's love moved Him to take *loving and powerful* action to save us! As He took action for us, so let us take loving action for others!

H → Honor your father and your mother.

(Exodus 20:12)

This is the fourth commandment. Parents are God's *visible* representatives to their children – *to honor parents is to honor God*; to dishonor them is to dishonor God. Children honor their parents by *loving, cherishing, serving, and obeying them!*

I → I am the vine; you are the branches.

(John 15:5)

A vine *CAN* survive without a branch, but a branch *CANNOT* survive without a vine. We received spiritual life through Jesus; NOW, *God nourishes* that life through the Bible to keep us in Christ!

J → Jesus wept.

(John 11:35)

Jesus is true God, begotten of His Father from eternity, and also true Man, who lived in our place, died for sins, and wept in connection with the death of His friend Lazarus and with all who were grieving. Jesus truly cares about everyone!

K → Keep your tongue from evil.

(Psalm 34:13)

When God made us His children through Baptism (Titus 3:5), He also gave us a *new nature* that desires to please Him in every way. However, until we physically die, we also continue to have our *old nature*, which is opposed to God. Though we can go against God, *let us honor Him with our words!*

L → Lead us not into temptation.

(Matthew 6:13)

This is the sixth petition of the Lord's Prayer. *God does not tempt us* (James 1:13-15). But we ask Him to lead us away from people and places that may tempt us to sin and could lead us away from Jesus!

(John 10:27)

All who trust in Jesus as Savior are His sheep; they desire to listen to Him by doing whatever He says!

N → No one can serve two masters.

(Matthew 6:24)

Who controls your life? God or money! To which one are you more devoted? Having our loving God as our Master is always best!

O → O LORD my God, I take refuge in you.

(Psalm 7:1)

Psalm 46:1 declares: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

Therefore, may the Almighty God always be our refuge – thus our place of safety and protection!

P → Praise the LORD.

(Psalm 149:9)

The Lord has created us, saved us, and daily provides all of our needs! *He is worthy* of all these words and more: "Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" (Rev. 7:12) *Let us praise Him every day and in every way!*
