Acts 2:14a, 22-36 ESV

Are You Benefitting from the Holy Trinity?

Introduction: Dear friends: Did you hear the exciting news about the latest giveaway: The first ten people who show up in person at Gillingham Ford in Parma on Monday at noon with the secret password will receive a new car; furthermore, I know the secret password and I'm willing to share it with you! So, ⇒are you excited, ⇒are you interested in receiving the password, and ⇒are you planning to benefit?

We all like *something* for *nothing*; we like it even more when the something is valuable! So a car fits into that category, it can bless us in many ways; but even a new car will eventually be put on the scrap heap. So *today's giveaway* is even *more valuable* because it is *eternal*. Let's take note of *the Holy Trinity* and *His benefits to us* in Acts chapter 2 (references to the Holy Trinity are coded as follows: Father, Son, Holy Spirit):

- 1. The Setting: 14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them.... // That is what Peter did on the Day of Pentecost, right after the Holy Spirit had been poured out. So it was not really Peter but the Holy Spirit speaking through Peter to bring us God's important message. Therefore, may God enable us to +listen, +understand, and +eternally benefit!
- 2. Notice Who Did What: We pick up partway through Peter's sermon: 22 "Men of Israel, hear these words:
 - a. Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that

God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— // So Peter is talking about the Jesus who grew up in Nazareth; then note that God the Father did miracles through Him to prove Jesus' connection with God. Even Nicodemus said to Jesus: "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him" (John 3:2 ESV). So let us believe in Jesus and rejoice in the forgiveness we have through Him!

- b. ²³ this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed [you did it] by the hands of lawless men [the Roman governor and soldiers]. // So God the Father planned how He would save us, knowing all the details in advance. Then Jesus obediently followed the Father's plan to take away the sins of the world! Those who know Jesus, who believe in Him as their Savior, have that great eternal benefit!
- c. ²⁴ God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. // So *people did their wicked part, *Jesus did His saving part, and *the Father did His raising part. God's goodness is greater than our badness! In Christ we are forgiven!
- 3. David's Prophecy about the Coming Savior: The Lutheran Study Bible has this note: "...through David, Christ speaks prophetically of his own soul's deliverance and His body's escape from corruption" (1834). 25 For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord

always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; 26 therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope.
27 For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption.
28 You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence. " // As Jesus lived here trusting His Father and tiving in harmony with His will for Our daily Christian lives!

- a. Who was David talking about? ²⁹ "Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. ³⁰ Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him [to David] that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, ³¹ he [David] foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. // So David died and is still dead, but Jesus' body did NOT decay, NOR did His soul remain in hades. Therefore, we should take very special note of this Jesus!
- b. How do those words apply to Jesus? ³² This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. ³³ Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. ³⁴ For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself [David] says, "The Lord"

[God the Father] said to my Lord [God the Son], "Sit at my right hand, 35 until I make your enemies your footstool." // We are blessed by the Trinity:

- i. The Father created everything thru the Son.
- ii. The Father sent His Son to remove our sins.
- iii. The Son is the winner over sin and death.
- iv. The Holy Spirit came *from* the Father *to* the Son *to* us to give us eternal life thru Jesus!
- 4. The Concluding Truth: ³⁶ Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

 // So *the Savior promised to Adam and Eve, *the Messiah, *the One Anointed by the Holy Spirit, *the One through whom God the Father did many miracles, *the One who willingly received our sins and paid our penalty, *the One raised by the Father on the 3rd day, *the One who ascended to the Father's right hand on the 40th day, *the One who poured out the Holy Spirit on the 50th day, and *the One who is now reigning over all things for the good of those who trust in Him, *He is both Lord and Christ!* Therefore, let us *continually* be sorry for our sins and trust in Him alone as our Savior!

Conclusion: Regarding the password and free car, that is not true⊗; but God's gift of forgiveness through Jesus is true⊚! Therefore, ⇒ seeing the great necessity of having God's forgiveness, ⇒let us gladly receive and eternally benefit! And all God's people said: *Amen!*
