1 God, 3 Persons For Our Salvation!!!

The Holy Trinity - 2018

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: On this Sunday of the Holy Trinity, we believe, teach, and confess that there is 1 God, and yet, at the same time, that 1 God includes 3 Persons: •the Person of the Father, •the Person of the Son, and •the Person of the Holy Spirit! As those three Persons worked together to create all things, so they also work together for our salvation!!!

Today, as we focus on the middle part of Acts chapter 2, let us *see and *marvel at the individual work, as well as the collective work, of the Holy Trinity to save us from our sins!

- 1. Miracles, Crucifixion, Resurrection: 14 But Peter, standing with the eleven [the eleven other apostles, on the Day of Pentecost, which was 50 days after Easter], lifted up his voice and addressed them: 22 "Men of Israel, hear these words: // As Peter spoke God's Word, the Holy Spirit was at work through that Word!
 - a. Miracles: Jesus of Nazareth [the Son of God], a man attested to you by God [the Father] with mighty works and wonders and signs that God [the Father] did through him [His Son] in your midst, as you yourselves know— // Peter established the connection between God the Father and Jesus by referencing the miracles!

- b. <u>Crucifixion</u>: ²³ this <u>Jesus</u> [God the Son in human flesh], delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of <u>God</u> [the Father], you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. // As Peter spoke to Jews, he reminded them of what they had done 53 days earlier on Good Friday as they handed Jesus over to Pilate to crucify Him but he also declared that it happened because God the Father had planned it out!
- c. Resurrection: ²⁴ God [the Father] raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him [the Son of God] to be held by it. // Keep in mind, the Jewish leaders thought Jesus was teaching and acting in opposition to God the Father; therefore, again, Peter reinforced the connection between the Father and Jesus with the Father raising Him up!
- Father > Spirit > David > Son: In this section the Holy Spirit moved David to write a prophecy: ²⁵ For David says concerning <u>him</u> [the LORD, God the Father],
 - a. These words could be spoken by David and by Jesus: 'I saw the Lord [God the Father] always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; ²⁶ therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. // Both for David and for Jesus, God the Father was with them and blessed them!
 - b. These words could be spoken only by Jesus: ²⁷ For you [my Father] will not abandon my soul [the soul of Your Son] to Hades [the place of the dead], or let your Holy One [Your Holy Son] see corruption. // So the Holy Spirit spoke through David to prophecy about Jesus' resurrection!

c. These words could be spoken only by David: ²⁸ You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.' // The way for David, for us, and for all others is repentance: sorrow for sin and faith in Jesus; both are accomplished in us by the Spirit working through God's Word!

3. David, the Christ:

- a. <u>David</u>: ²⁹ Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. // In other words, <u>David's body did see corruption</u>.
- b. The Christ: ³⁰ Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God [the Father] had sworn with an oath to him [to David] that he would set one of his descendants on his throne [namely, Jesus], ³¹ he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ [the Son of God, who put on flesh through the Virgin Mary and was anointed with the Holy Spirit], that...
 - i. <u>Death</u>: <u>He</u> [the Son of God] was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. // Those words pointed ahead to Jesus!
 - ii. Resurrection: ³² This Jesus God [the Father] raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. // So God the Father did it, thus He accepted Jesus' sacrifice for our sins! Then Peter said, "How do we know?" Because we are eyewitnesses!
 - iii. Ascension and Pentecost: 33 Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God [the Father Jesus' ascension], and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he [the Son]

has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. // We confess in the Nicene Creed that the Holy Spirit "proceeds from the Father and the Son"; Father to Son; then Son to believers! The pouring out of the Spirit took place on the Day of Pentecost!

- David: ³⁴ For David did not ascend into the heavens, // Instead, David died and was buried; ONLY Jesus ascended!
- The Christ: but he [David, speaking by the Holy Spirit] himself says, 'The Lord [God the Father] said to my Lord [God the Son], "Sit at my right hand, "suntil I make your enemies your footstool." // The Father said those words to Jesus, not to David.
- 4. Uh Oh: ³⁶ Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God [the Father] has made him [His Son] both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." // When Adam and Eve fell into sin, so did all of their future descendants; therefore, God promised to send His Son!! Even though many did not and do not ▶recognize Him or ▶trust in Him, He is BOTH LORD AND CHRIST! He won salvation for everyone, but ONLY those who continue to know Him (John 17:3) will eternally benefit from His work!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, You have done awesome work for our salvation; <u>Father</u> – *TY for Your plan*; <u>Jesus</u> – *TY for living and dying*; HS – *TY for bringing us to the Father through Jesus and keeping us trusting in Jesus!*

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
