On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry

Sunday, December 15 at 8:00 & 10:45 Third Sunday in Advent – 2013

Wednesday Services at 11 & 7; Meals at 12 & 6

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." (Eph. 1:2 NAS) The weekly themes in Advent are following this pattern:

- Week 1: Jesus' second coming; <u>remain ready!</u>
- Week 2: John the Baptist; repent!
- Week 3: Transition from John to Jesus; believe!
- Week 4: The birth of our Savior; rejoice!

So today, on this third Sunday in Advent, we focus on the words of this hymn: **On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry**. As we consider those words, notice their Biblical connections AND the transition from John to Jesus. Then, by God's grace, let us be sorry for our sins and believe in Jesus as our Savior!

- 1. Stanza 1: Mt. 3:1-6; Is. 40:3; Ps. 34:18; Is. 52:7; Jn. 1:19-23
 - a. On Jordan's bank the Baptist's cry John was at his workplace, on the bank of the Jordan River; that is where he called people to repent to see the differences between God's Holy Word and their unholy lives; then to +be sorry and +trust in the coming Savior!
 - b. **Announces that the Lord is nigh** That means He is imminent, close, approaching! *NOT a time to continue in sin, but a time to repent!*

- i. When a robber trips an alarm it's time to run!
- ii. When a losing football team is given the two-minute warning it's time to score!
- iii. When a person hears God's call to repent– it's time to do just that!
- c. Awake and hearken [listen, give respectful attention], [Why?] for he brings, Glad tidings [good news] of the King of kings! We have all done wrong AND we cannot make it right; therefore, Jesus, the King of kings, has come to remove our wrongs and make us right in God's sight!
- 2. Stanza 2: Jn. 1:23; 1 Jn. 1:9; Gal. 2:20
 - a. Then cleansed be ev'ry life from sin; Make straight the way for God within A straight way is always in full harmony with God's Word; it's never a combination of God's way AND our way!

 Consider these words of truth, blessing, and condemnation: "The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth.

 19 He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; He will also hear their cry and will save them.

 20 The LORD keeps all who love Him; But all the wicked, He will destroy." (Ps. 145:18 NAS)
 - b. And let us all our hearts prepare, For Christ to come and enter there. // Our preparation is NOT to make ourselves acceptable to God; we cannot do that; we are powerless, helpless! These words contain the remedy we need: "...the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" (Lk. 18:13 ESV)

- 3. Stanza 3: Ps. 48:3; Is. 40:7-10; Gen. 15:1; Zeph. 3:17
 - a. We hail [welcome] Thee as our Savior, Lord, Our refuge and our great reward So WHEN, by God's grace, ◆we recognize our sins, ◆we are sorry for our sins, and ◆we know Jesus as our Savior; THEN we also desire to →welcome Him, →obey Him, and →rejoice in Him!
 - b. Without Thy grace we waste away, Like flow'rs that wither and decay. // A flower, so beautiful yet so temporary! As a flower cannot stop itself from withering away, so neither can we! BUT we have God's grace; the favorable way in which He looks upon us not because of what we have done, but because of what He has done! "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom 5:8 NAS)
- 4. Stanza 4: Num. 6:24-26; Ps. 67:1; 2 Cor. 4:6; Mt. 17:2
 - a. Lay on the sick Thy healing hand, And make the fallen strong to stand In today's gospel reading we heard Jesus make this declaration of what the Father had already done through Him (John 10:32): "The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is preached to the poor." (Mat 11:5-6 NIV)
 - b. Show us the glory of Thy face, Till beauty springs in ev'ry place. // That is what Peter, James, and John saw when Jesus was transfigured before them "His face shone like the sun..." (Mt. 17:2 NAS) Then, when Jesus' returns, we will also see His glory (Mk. 8:38)!

5. Stanza 5: Ps. 146:7

- a. All praise, eternal Son, to Thee, Whose advent [coming] sets Thy people free The Bible says that "...Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him." (Heb 9:28 ESV) So now, through the Christ, we are forgiven; then, when He comes again, we will be completely whole!
- b. Whom with the Father we adore, And Holy
 Spirit evermore Those words describe the lives
 of those who trust in Jesus; so we adore—thus
 praise the Holy Trinity, we love—thus obey God's
 Word, and we trust—thus are at peace (Is. 26:3)!
