SERMON and SCRIPTURE READING: Episode 3: The Real "Star" of Christmas

Numbers 24:1-18, 25 AAT

¹ When Balaam saw that the LORD wanted to bless Israel, he didn't look for omens as he had done before but turned toward the desert. ² Balaam looked and saw Israel camping tribe by tribe, and God's Spirit came on him, ³ and he spoke his message:

"Balaam, Beor's son, is speaking, the man with opened eyes is speaking, 4 he who hears God's words is speaking; he who has a vision from the Almighty falls down, and his eyes are opened: 5 How beautiful are your tents, Jacob, and your dwelling places, Israel, ⁶ like valleys spread out, like gardens by a river, like aloes the LORD planted, like cedars by the water. ⁷ He irrigates with his buckets, and his seed has plenty of water. His king will rise higher than Agag, and his kingdom will be raised high. 8 When God led him out of Egypt, he had the strength of a wild bull. He will devour nations who are his enemies, crushing their bones and piercing them with his arrows. ⁹ He crouches and lies down like a lion and like a mature lion--who will rouse him? Blessed is he who blesses you, and cursed is he who curses you!"

¹⁰ Balak got very angry with Balaam, and he clapped his hands. "I called you to curse my enemies," Balak told Balaam, "and here you have

blessed them three times. ¹¹ So hurry on back home. I intended to reward you richly, but you see, the LORD has kept you from being rewarded."

¹² Balaam answered Balak: "Didn't I already tell the messengers you sent me: 13 'If Balak gives me his palace full of silver and gold, I can't go against the LORD's instructions and of myself do anything good or bad; I must say what the LORD tells me'? ¹⁴ And now look, I'm going back to my people. Come, let me tell you what these people will do to your people in the future." ¹⁵ Then he spoke his message:

"Balaam, Beor's son, is speaking, the man with clear eyes is speaking, ¹⁶ he who hears God's words is speaking; he knows what the Most High knows. He has a vision from the Almighty and falls down, and his eyes are opened: ¹⁷ I see Him who is not here now; I behold Him who will come later. A Star will come from Jacob, a Scepter will rise from Israel; He will smash Moab's head and destroy all the sons of Sheth. ¹⁸ Edom will be occupied, Seir will be dispossessed by its enemies, and so Israel will show its power....

²⁵ Then Balaam left to go back home, and Balak also went his way.
