Introduction: Dear friends in Christ:

Try to imagine what was going on at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport this past Tuesday... Since planes needed to land, the plowing crew was busy preparing the runway to successfully receive the planes. In a similar way, almost 2,000 years ago, John the Baptizer was busy preparing human hearts to successfully receive the Messiah!

As we focus today on the beginning of Mark chapter 1, let's

→ think about God's work through John and → be open to
God's work through us!

1. Beginning of the Good News: ¹ The beginning of the gospel [the good news] of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. // Let's focus on the term beginning:

- a. The very beginning: Before the fall into sin, there was no need for the gospel. However, as soon as the people fell, which brought immediate spiritual death and eventual physical death, Good News was desperately needed! So the beginning of the beginning of the gospel was on the day of the first sin, because, on that very day, God FIRST PROMISED to send the Savior!
- b. <u>OT reminders</u>: When we expect something to happen, yet it doesn't happen for a long time, we are tempted to give up. Therefore, the LORD gave MANY REMINDERS throughout the OT about the promise He made to send His Son.
- c. The beginning of the Messiah's arrival: Since John was sent to prepare the way for the Messiah, the coming of John certainly signaled the beginning of THE ACTUAL COMING of the Messiah!
- 2. Prophecy about John's Work: ² As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: "BEHOLD, I [God the Father] SEND MY MESSENGER [John the Baptizer] AHEAD OF YOU [my Son], WHO WILL PREPARE YOUR WAY; ³ [MY MESSENGER will be] THE VOICE OF ONE CRYING IN THE WILDERNESS, 'MAKE READY THE WAY OF THE LORD, MAKE HIS PATHS STRAIGHT.'" // That statement was *breathed-out by God and *written down by Isaiah about 700 years before the birth of John. Then, according to God's timing, *John was sent, *John cried out in the wilderness, and *God used John's preaching to prepare the way for the promised Savior!

- 3. Main Message of John: ⁴ John the Baptist [Baptizer (Oh, how we wish he would have been a Lutheran !]] appeared in the wilderness preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.
 - a. The Bible literally says: John was "preaching a baptism of repentance into a sending away of sins." Lenski wrote: "The sins are taken from the sinner and are sent away so far and in such a way that even God will not find them on the day of judgment" (31). The Bible has this good news: "As far as the east is from the west [which is an infinite distance], So far has He [the LORD] removed our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:12 NAS). ©
 - b. This was the process: ▶John preached, ▶the Holy Spirit made the people sorry for their sins, ▶the people confessed their sins, and ▶the people were baptized for the forgiveness of their sins!
- 4. Response to John's Message: ⁵ And all the country of Judea was going out to him, and all the people of Jerusalem; and they were being baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins.
 - a. Why did they go out to John? He was different preaching in the wilderness, rather than in the city; wearing rough clothing (camel's hair), rather than a priestly garment; eating unusual food (locust and honey), rather than common food; telling the full truth of God, rather than telling what was comfortable for people to hear; and offering God's gift of forgiveness, rather than worldly advice!

- b. Why will people come to us? Because they know we practice what we preach (we do what we say); we care about them; we pray for them; we are kind to them; we are honest with them; we speak words that are relevant to them; and we want them to have God's forgiveness and peace!
- 5. Humble Life of John: ⁶ John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and his diet was locusts and wild honey. // What do those things tell us about John? He focused on •God and •God's will for his life, rather than his own comforts. For us, comforts are certainly nice; however, as followers of Jesus, we are called to be like John by denying ourselves and doing God's will!
- 6. Pointing to Jesus: ⁷ And he was preaching, and saying, "After me One is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to stoop down and untie the thong of His sandals. ⁸ I baptized you with water; but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."// In the eyes of the people, John was a great prophet of God, but John DID NOT want the people focusing on Him! Therefore, John basically said, I am the lowest, Jesus is the highest; don't focus on me, trust in Jesus, the Christ!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, thank You for the great example of John – so obedient and such a blessing to countless people! In our own small way, help us to be like John to others!
