
## Week 12 Parent Sheet: The Ten Commandments

## <u>The Old Testament</u> focuses on the fall into sin, the promise of the Savior, and the many events pointing ahead to the Savior; it covers approximately 4,000 years of history; this timeline shows some key events from creation to Jesus!



**Background:** God used Moses to lead the descendants of Jacob/Israel out of their slavery in Egypt; then, at Mount Sinai, God gave them the Ten Commandments!

**This Lesson:** The Commandments were given to instruct God's people how to show love to God and to others!

## The Ten Commandments:

- 1. <u>What word</u> summarizes the Ten Commandments? "Love"
- 2. How does God love us?
  - a. God FIRST loved us by CREATING us!
  - b. God CONTINUES to love us by:
    - i. **PROVIDING** all that we need for this life!
    - ii. SENDING JESUS to take away our sins!
- 3. <u>Who</u> do the Ten Commandments tell us to love? God and Others
- 4. <u>Why</u> do we try to keep the Ten Commandments?
  - a. To thank God for loving us!
  - b. To show our love to God (1-3)!
  - c. To show our love to others (4-10)!
- 5. How are the Ten Commandments like a mirror?
  - a. They show us our SIN because we cannot perfectly keep them! Our sins make us dirty!
  - b. They show us our need for God's forgiveness through Jesus! <u>Jesus washes us clean</u>! Why?
    - i. Jesus is the Son of God!
    - ii. Jesus lived without sin as our substitute!
    - iii. Jesus was punished for our sins!
    - iv. Jesus rose from the dead to show His victory!
    - v. Jesus made the one way to heaven!
- 6. <u>What are the Ten Commandments?</u> (*The words in parenthesis summarize each Commandment*):

 You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. (<u>God's Name</u>)

 Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. (<u>God's Word</u>)

 Honor your father and your mother. (<u>God's</u> <u>Representatives</u>)

5: You shall not murder. (God's Gift of Life)

<mark>6:</mark> You shall not commit adultery. (<u>God's Gift of</u> <u>Marriage</u>)

7: You shall not steal. (God's Gift of Possessions)

8: You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. (*God's Gift of a Good Reputation*)

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.
(God's Gift of Contentment)

**10:** You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor. (*God's Gift of Contentment*)

<u>Note</u>: Some church bodies number the commandments differently, *but that is not significant – because the Bible DOES NOT number the commandments*. Instead, these things are significant:

- God gave the commandments so that people would know how to love God – by keeping them.
- However, since we have all fallen short of keeping them perfectly, God sent His Son to live, suffer, and die to take away all sins; then He rose victorious!
- We should do our best to keep the commandments, but it is ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT to repent, trust in Jesus alone for eternal life, and honor Him in our lives!
