Introduction

- Adults, youth, and children are invited to join with us in *making a joyful noise to the Lord!*
- Music literacy is helpful, but not a prerequisite.
- Supplemental musicians are welcome.
- Our choir focuses on serving the Lord with music making and learning in a warm, friendly environment!

Our Two Choir Seasons

We have two choir seasons, which cover the *festival* time of the church year:

1. **October – December**, including:
Reformation (last Sunday in October),
Thanksgiving Eve, the Advent Season,
Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day.
2. **March – May**, including: the Lenten
Season, Holy Week, Easter,
Ascension, the Day of Pentecost, and
the Holy Trinity.

Choir Practices

The choir practices once each week during each of the two seasons. The practices normally take place on Tuesdays at 6:30 PM and last approximately one hour.

Choir at Worship Services

The choir participates in worship in several ways:

1. We praise God in response to His love for us.
2. At least 8 times each season, the choir sings anthems, psalms or hymns to enhance the worship of the congregation.
3. There is opportunity to learn and use hand chimes.
4. Additional instruments are added when volunteers can be found.

The goal is to participate in both the early and the late services. Accommodations are made since not all are unable to attend both services.

Fall Season Services

When the Choir Participates

- ◆ Reformation Day (Sunday, last in October)
- ◆ All Saints Day (Sunday, first in November)
- ◆ Church Anniversary (Sunday, closest to November 13)
- ◆ Thanksgiving Eve (Wednesday)
- ◆ Christmas Eve (December 24)
- ◆ Three more additional Services as scheduled.

Spring Season Services

When the Choir Participates

- ◆ Palm Sunday (one week before Easter)
- ◆ Good Friday (Friday, of Holy Week)
- ◆ Easter Sunday
- ◆ Mother's Day (Sunday, second in May)
- ◆ Ascension Day (Thursday, 40 days after Easter)
- ◆ The Day of Pentecost (Sunday, 50 days after Easter)
- ◆ The Holy Trinity (Sunday, 57 days after Easter)
- ◆ One more additional Service as scheduled.
