## The Essential Practice of Daily Devotion! <u>WHY</u>?

10<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost / 9<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Trinity – 2012 Sunday, August 5→ 8:00 & 10:45 ◆ Monday, August 6→ 7 PM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, Spending time in Daily Devotion includes:

- **+** Listening to God *by thoughtfully reading the Bible*.
- **†** Talking to God with our words and thoughts.

Listening and talking are normal parts of any relationship.

Since our sin ended our relationship with God, He took action to remove our sin through the *sinless life* and *sacrificial death* of Jesus! God also took action by the Holy Spirit working through the Bible to give us the gift of faith to trust in Jesus as our Savior! Through Jesus *our sins are forgiven* and *our relationship with God is restored!* Now, *as a result*, we desire to grow in that relationship through *\*listening to God through the Bible* and *\*talking to God through prayer*.

- 1. Why is Daily Devotion Necessary? Daily Devotion is an essential characteristic of every true Christian:
  - a. <u>It feeds our spiritual lives</u>: <sup>NAS</sup> Matthew 4:4 ..."Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God."

- b. <u>It firmly roots us in Christ</u>: NAS Colossians 2:6 As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, <sup>7</sup> having been <u>firmly rooted</u> and now being <u>built up</u> in Him and <u>established</u> in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude.
- c. <u>It shows our relationship with Jesus</u>: NAS John 8:31 Jesus therefore was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "<u>If you abide in My word,</u> <u>then you are truly disciples of Mine</u>; <sup>32</sup> and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

## What Are Some Daily Devotion Benefits?

- a. Receive a daily message from God *He speaks to us through His Word*!
- b. Respond to God's message in prayer Prayer is simply speaking to God in words and thoughts. The BEST words and thoughts are those which are in agreement with God's Word; therefore, Jesus said: NAS John 15:7 "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it shall be done for you."
- c. Recognize God's hand of blessing each week by reviewing and re-praying your previous seven days of devotions!
- d. Grow in your knowledge of the Bible you will be blessed!
- e. Grow in your faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior *resulting in more peace in every circumstance!*

- f. Learn about God's will / plan for your life God's children know God's ways are best!
- g. Be better equipped to live and teach the Bible All Christians live the Bible and, in a sense, all are teachers! Whenever we identify ourselves as Christians, people are listening and watching; St. Paul explained: NIV 2 Corinthians 3:2 "You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everybody."

## What Are Some Encouraging Passages?

- a. <sup>NAS</sup> Joshua 1:8 This book of the law [Genesis Deuteronomy] shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it; for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have <u>success</u>.
  - i. Do YOU desire prosperity and success?
  - ii. Through what steps does God grant those blessings?
    - 1. Meditate on God's Word day and night.
    - 2. Be careful to do whatever it says.
    - 3. God will grant *His version* of prosperity and success!
- b. <sup>NAS</sup> Psalm 1:1 How blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, Nor sit in the seat of scoffers! <sup>2</sup> But his delight is in the law of the LORD, And in His law he meditates day and

**night**. <sup>3</sup> And he will be like a tree firmly planted by streams of water, Which <u>yields its fruit in its</u> <u>season</u>, And <u>its leaf does not wither</u>; And <u>in</u> <u>whatever he does, he prospers</u>.

- i. What should we avoid?
- ii. What should we do?
- iii. What will God grant? Blessings, but not heaven; that is God's gift thru Jesus!

## What Are Two Lutheran Daily Devotionals?

- a. <u>Portals of Prayer</u> (LCMS CPH):
  - i. A different writer each month (pastors and laypeople).
  - ii. Each day stands alone.
  - iii. Shorter.
- b. <u>Meditations</u> (WELS Northwestern):
  - i. A different writer each week (pastors).
  - ii. Each day stands alone.
  - iii. Each week, Sunday Saturday, works through a section of the Bible.
  - iv. Longer, more in depth.

**Conclusion**: As we eat physical food to nourish our bodies, so we need spiritual food – *the Word of God* – to nourish our souls! If you have a practice of daily devotion, *I praise God*!
