You Are Here – Part 7

The Son of God Arrives to Redeem Mankind!

Fourth Sunday in Advent – 2012 Galatians 4:1-7 NAS

December 23 -> 10:00

Christmas Eve at 6; Christmas Day at 10

Sunday, 12/30: 1 Service at 10; Monday, 12/31: New Year's Eve at 7

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, this sermon brings us to part 7 of the series: **You Are Here!** So where is HERE? Let's look at today's brochure insert to determine our location on the timeline of world history!

- 1. God's OT Work of Keeping People On-Track for JESUS:
 - a. An earthly example Now I say, as long as the heir is a child, he does not differ at all from a slave although he is owner of everything, but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by the father. // Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "The men named by the father had charge of the property, counseled the boy, defended and directed him.... It is plain...that <code>Lsuch_I</code> a father is not acting foolishly... but for the minor's benefit, lest he spend and squander his money foolishly." (245)
 - b. A spiritual application So also we, while we were children [believing God's promise to save (Gen. 3:15), but lacking a mature understanding of what God

meant], were held in bondage under the elemental things of the world. // In other words, the OT ceremonial law – which included the animal sacrifices – kept the people in bondage, or under a burden, but for a good purpose: To keep them focused on the coming Savior!

<u>Parents to children</u> – I urge you to keep working with your children to help them memorize the ABC Bible Verses and the Six Chief Parts of Luther's Small Catechism. Such memorizing does not save, but it will keep them focused on the Savior who has come!

- 2. God's Sending of His Son: But when the fulness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. //
 - a. But when the fulness of the time came As I fill this glass, imagine how time was slowly filling up during the OT era; as this glass has a limited capacity, so did time between God's promise to send (Gen. 3:15) and the arrival of the Savior!
 - b. God sent forth His Son The angel Gabriel said to Mary: NAS Luke 1:35 "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy offspring shall be called the Son of God." ...

 38 And Mary said, "...be it done to me according to your word." That is WHEN God sent forth His Son!



- a. **born of a woman** The LORD inspired Isaiah to write: NAS Isaiah 7:14 "...Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel." He was born of a woman!
- b. born under the Law Jesus said: ESV Matthew 5:17 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets [the OT Scriptures]; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them." Jesus, on our behalf, kept the Law perfectly!
- c. in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law God worked through Jesus to buy us back! The Bible says that NAS 2
 Corinthians 5:19 "...God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them..."
- d. that we might receive the adoption as sons –
 Jesus is the *only begotten* Son of God, *but we are*the adopted children of God thru faith in Jesus!
- 3. God's Work of Eternal Transformation: And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" Therefore you are no longer a slave, but a son; and if a son, then an heir through God. // Dr. Kretzmann gave this explanation: "So God sends the Spirit that lives in His Son, in order to make us sure that we are His brothers and coheirs..." (246)

Conclusion: We have all done wrong, but God has made us right in His sight through Jesus! That is Christmas! And all God's people said: Amen!
