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Series: How to Live as a Christian – Part 3

Properly Boast!

James 1:9-12 ESV

5th Sunday of Easter – 2013

Sunday, April 28 at 8:00 & 10:45; Monday, April 29 at 7 PM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, as we return to the book of James remember: The book is practical instruction for
 Christians! James did NOT write about being saved; instead, he told the saved how to live!

- 1. Should Christians Ever Boast? Doesn't that sound completely wrong to boast! But James wrote: Let the lowly brother boast in his exaltation [in his high position], and the rich [brother boast] in his humiliation [in his humble situation], because [the rich brother] like a flower of the grass he will pass away. // So James addressed both the lowly or poor Christian and the rich Christian. Each one because of his situation is to boast (talk to others) in a different way!
- The Lowly or Poor Christian: Although his earthly possessions are far less than others, he is to boast (tell others) about his *eternal blessings*, such as: •God's forgiveness, •God's peace, and •God's promise of a wonderful eternity! Since life here is so very short in comparison to eternity, *the poor are called to boast about the life to come!*

- 3. The Rich Christian: Although he will be tempted to see his riches as personal accomplishments, which could lead to trust in self, he is to boast (tell others) about the temporary nature of his earthly life! James wrote this reminder: "For the sun rises with its scorching heat and withers the grass; its flower falls, and its beauty perishes. So also will the rich man fade away in the midst of his pursuits." Solomon wrote this warning in Ecclesiastes: NIV Ecclesiastes 5:13 "I have seen a grievous evil under the sun: wealth hoarded to the harm of its owner..."
 - a. <u>Therefore, the rich man should say</u>: "Oh yes, I have many earthly possessions, but they are SO temporary like flowers, beautiful one day but gone the next!" Such boasting will help both the rich man and others to keep a proper perspective on earthly riches.
 - b. Paul wrote to Timothy: ^{ESV} 1 Timothy 6:10 "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith..." Think about the man who couldn't pass up the double-time pay on Sunday; he reasoned, "I'll work Sundays for a short time; everything will work out fine." But weeks turned to months turned to years; now he is dead in his sins! Jesus was right: ^{NIV} Matthew 6:24 "... You cannot serve both God and Money."
 - c. <u>Jesus said</u>: ^{NIV} Luke 12:15 "...a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."
 - i. So what does your life consist of?

- ii. What is most important to you your possessions or your relationship with God?
- 4. A Summary Statement: Verse 12 summarizes vv. 2-11: Blessed is the man who remains steadfast [who endures, who doesn't give up] under trial, for when he has [by God's grace] stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. // Life can be tough, so we need God's blessing of wisdom to rightly understand how God is working all things together for good (Rom. 8:28) in our Christian lives! Then, with that wisdom, God will strengthen us to endure every test – and to rightly boast along the way – until we finally receive "the crown of life..." May these words of God instruct us and strengthen us to endure to the very end:
 - a. <u>James wrote about Job</u>: ^{ESV} James 5:11 Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job...
 - i. After Job received word that his 11,000 animals and 10 children were dead ^{ESV} Job 1:21 ... he said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD." His trials were great, but he did not reject the LORD!
 - ii. Then, by God's grace, job remained steadfast; then the Bible tells us the

- b. Jesus wrote these words to the church in Smyrna: ESV Revelation 2:10 Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested... Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life.
- c. So what should we do when the going gets very tough? God gave us this answer through David:
 ^{NAS} Psalm 55:22 "Cast your burden upon the LORD, and He will sustain you; He will never allow the righteous to be shaken."

Conclusion: Let's remember and apply God's Word:

- If we are *in Christ but poor*, how should we boast?
- If we are *in Christ but rich*, how should we boast?

Let us never do such boasting to be saved, but let us properly boast because we are saved through Jesus' finished work! And all God's people said: **Amen!**

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
