Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today is Palm Sunday, which is the beginning of Holy Week! Today we will consider some of what happened on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday; then, on Holy Thursday, some of what happened from late Tuesday through Thursday; then, on Good Friday, we will focus on that most important day when Jesus finished His work to remove our sins!

To gain even greater benefit from God's Holy Word please take your own Bible or a pew Bible, then turn to Matthew chapter 21 (page 1531 in a pew Bible).

1. Palm Sunday: The Triumphal Entry (read 21:1-11): The crowds called Jesus "the Son of David," thus the Promised Savior, yet most were looking for a new king to overthrow the Romans rather than a Savior from sin! Do YOU realize that Jesus is the One you need the most?

2. Holy Monday:

- a. <u>Jesus at the Temple</u> (21:12-17): Jesus disrupted the buying and selling so that everyone *Jews and Gentiles* would have a place to pray and worship! Even today God invites everyone to faithfully come and receive His eternal blessings!
- b. The Fig Tree Withers (21:18-22): From the Gospel of Mark, we know that Jesus cursed the tree on Monday; then it was found withered on Tuesday.
 Two lessons: (1) Don't give the impression of having

- fruit as the fig tree did when you have none! (2) The prayers of the righteous are powerful!
- 3. Holy Tuesday: What an amazing day! In the gospel of Matthew, 21:23 26:16 all occurred on Holy Tuesday!
 - a. <u>The Authority of Jesus</u> (21:23-27): When questioned Jesus responded to their question *with a question!*
 - b. The Parable of the Two Sons (read 21:28-32):
 Repentance is shown with actions, not with words!
 True repentance is worked by God in the heart; then it shows on the outside with a God-honoring life!

Hymn: "Delay Not, Delay Not"

- c. The Parable of the Tenants (21:33-46): Jesus wanted the people to see the wickedness of the religious leaders: They had prominence and power, but they were twisting the truth and rejecting the Savior!

 Today is similar, so be like the Bereans (Acts 17:11) by comparing *all that is SAID to be truth with *GOD'S Word of Truth!
- d. <u>The Parable of the Wedding Banquet</u> (Read 22:1-14): Jesus taught that *everyone is being welcomed into heaven*, **but** *everyone who enters* MUST be wearing *the righteousness of Jesus Christ!*

Hymn: "Jesus, Thy Blood and Righteousness"

- e. <u>Paying Taxes to Caesar</u> (22:15-22): Christians honor God and *God's servant*, the government, by giving to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's!
- f. Marriage at the Resurrection (22:23-33): When "the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection," tried to discredit Jesus, He not only explained important realities about eternity **but** He also helped us understand that *people who have died in Jesus are*, in fact, *alive* and God remains *their God!*

- g. <u>The Greatest Commandment</u> (22:34-40): Jesus taught that love is important; <u>first</u>: love for God *by obeying His Word*; <u>second</u>: love for neighbor *by helping them according to their needs!*
- h. Whose Son Is the Christ? (Read 22:41-46): Jesus can only be David's son AND David's Lord if He is the Son of God in flesh AND the Son of God from eternity!
 Let us ever-embrace this truth: "I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord." (Apostles' Creed, Second Article, Explanation)

<u>Hymn</u>: "Crown Him with Many Crowns" LSB 525, vv. 1-2

- i. <u>Seven Woes</u> (23:1-39): <u>First</u> Jesus addressed the crowds and His disciples, telling them to do what the religious leaders teach *WHEN their teaching comes from the Scriptures!* <u>Second</u> Jesus addressed the religious leaders themselves, *calling them hypocrites!* "Greek actors were called *hypocrites.* Often, a single actor would play several different characters, and for each character the actor would use a different mask. So when they would switch characters, they would switch masks." Jesus wanted the hypocrites to see their hypocrisy and repent! So let us be <u>genuine from the inside out</u>; then, *knowing we have God's forgiveness through Jesus*, let us grow in ◆knowing and ◆living the Bible!
- j. Signs of the End of the Age (24:1-35): Some are very common today: wars, famines, earthquakes, and people falsely claiming to be the Christ! Every such sign should remind us of the great importance of being ready and remaining ready THROUGH JESUS!

- I. <u>The Parable of the Ten Virgins</u> (25:1-13): Jesus is calling us to *live expectantly!*
- m. <u>The Parable of the Talents</u> (25:14-30): Jesus is calling us to *live responsibly!*
- n. <u>The Sheep and the Goats</u> (25:31-46): Jesus is calling us to *live compassionately!*

Conclusion: Even though we live in a world of spiritual darkness, we are the light of the world as we reflect Jesus in word and deed. Peter described those who believe in Jesus with these words: "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light..." (1Pe 2:9 NAS) So let us shine the light of the Lord!

And all God's people said: Amen!

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k. The Day and Hour Unknown (24:36-51): Jesus said:

36 "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 37 As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. 38 For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; 39 and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man." (NIV) Now, think about today's world; how many are thinking about AND preparing for Jesus' return? Probably few ! Since we know Jesus and the truth of His coming, let us tell others!
