You Are Here – Part 8 Matthew 1:18-25 NAS The Roles of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus!

The Nativity of Our Lord – 2012 December 24 at 6 PM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, <u>please see today's</u>
 <u>brochure insert</u>, which includes a summary of our current 9-part sermon series. Before we go to Matthew chapter 1 – today's sermon text, open the brochure to the timeline so that I can help you understand → what has happened so far,
 → the significance of the Christ of Christmas, → where we are today—YOU ARE HERE, and → what is yet to come!

An Apparent Scandal – with a Christian Response:

 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows. When His mother Mary had been betrothed [engaged] to Joseph, before they came together [as husband and wife] she was found to be with child [PREGNANT] by the Holy Spirit. And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man [an OT Christian who was trusting in the Promised Savior], and not wanting to disgrace her [it seemed apparent to Joseph that she had had relations with another man; how else can a woman become pregnant], desired to put her away secretly [to end the engagement privately].

- 2. An Angel with a Crystal Clear Message:
 - a. But when he [Joseph] had considered this [to end their engagement privately], behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for that which has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit [in other words, she has not been with another man; instead, the child she has conceived is from God]."
 - *b.* ²¹ "And she will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for it is He who will save His people from their sins."
 - i. She [Mary] will bear a Son That is the role God gave to her; the Son sent from God received His humanity from Mary. The Athanasian Creed puts it this way: "He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father, before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age: perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh; Equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity."
 - ii. you [Joseph] shall call His name Jesus Joseph, the earthly father, had the role of naming the child Jesus, which means: The Lord saves!
 - iii. He [Jesus] who will save His people from their sins – Jesus did so by:

- Living without committing a single wrong.
- Receiving all the wrongs of all people when He was on His cross.
- 3. **+** Receiving God's punishment for every wrong.
- 4. **†** Declaring His victory—*It is finished!*
- 5. **†** Laying down His life!
- c. ²² Now all this took place that what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet Isaiah, might be fulfilled, saying, ²³ "Behold, the virgin [a woman who had never been with a man] shall be with child, and shall bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which translated means, "God with us." // God spoke through the apostle John to tell us even more about Immanuel: ^{NAS} John 1:1 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.² He was in the beginning with God.³ All things came into being by Him...¹⁴ And [4,000 years later] the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus is God in the flesh, the only Savior from sin!

3. An Expression of Faith – Obedience: And Joseph arose from his sleep, and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him [did not call off the engagement], and took her as his wife [went ahead with the wedding], and kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son [Mary remained a virgin during her entire pregnancy; then the text implies that her and Joseph had normal husband-wife relations]; and he called His name Jesus [just as the angel had told him].

Conclusion: Now, knowing more about:

- → The BIG PICTURE of all time.
- → The super-importance of the Christ.
- → Where you are now—YOU ARE HERE.
- ➔ The fact that Jesus will come again like a thief in the night.

Let us – by God's grace – be *ever-sorry for our sins, *ever-trusting in Jesus alone as our Savior, and *everconfident that through Him we are God's forgiven children!

Now, let us celebrate *the Christ of Christmas!* And all God's people said: *Amen!*
