## Don't Be a Fool, Jesus Is Risen!

Sunday, April 1 – <u>7:00</u> & 10:45 The Resurrection of Our Lord – 2018

Divine Service on Mondays: They resume on April 9 at 7 PM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today is the resurrection of our Lord, but it is also April Fool's Day. "Since 1900, Easter has fallen on April Fool's Day only four times − 1923, 1934, 1945 and 1956. [The last time was 61 years ago!] It won't happen again until 2029.¹ April Fool's Day is intended for practical jokes; those who fall for them usually hear the words, "April Fools!" The jokes are normally harmless, but being an actual fool is a most serious matter! Therefore, this sermon will include ♦ the truth and joy of the resurrection and ♦ some sad realities about being a fool.

## 1. The Gospel: 1 Corinthians 15:1-5

- a. What it is: The good news that Jesus \*is the Son of God in human flesh, \*lived as our sinless substitute, \*suffered our punishment, \*laid down His life, \*was raised, and \*is alive forever!
- b. The Corinthians: Paul preached the gospel to them; then, by God's grace, they received it and stood upon it as their confidence for heaven! Then Paul warned them: By this gospel 2 "...you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you-- unless you believed in vain." What does that mean? Jesus and His finished

work ARE the good news, so those who know Him ARE saved! But relationships don't automatically continue; therefore, as we would hold fast to a bag of money, how much more should we hold fast to our Lord Jesus Christ! May we never be among those who believed in vain – who believed, but did NOT hold fast!

- c. Key factors of the gospel:
  - i. Christ died for our sins Since we have all earned eternal punishment, Jesus obediently took our place!
  - ii. <sup>4</sup> ... he was buried He was truly dead, so His body was wrapped and entombed!
  - iii. ...he was raised on the third day The third day was Sunday, which was also the OT festival of Firstfruits; since Jesus is the firstborn from the dead, those who know Him will also be raised to life!
  - iv. <sup>5</sup> ... he appeared He appeared ALIVE to many people! Alleluia! Jesus is risen! (He is risen indeed! Alleluia!)
- 2. A Fool: What is a fool? A person who acts unwisely; thus a person who has good information, but does not put that good information to good use!
  - a. <u>Stephen Hawking</u>: He is good example; some people considered him to be one of the smartest people on earth, so his brilliance gained him the best information, but he concluded that "There is no God." So how do we know he was a fool?

The Bible says, "The **fool** says in his heart, 'There is no God'" (Ps. 14:1 ESV). And we should not be surprised at his conclusion, because "as many as 93% of top-tier scientists do not believe in God" (Ibid.). Sadly for many, "Claiming to be wise, they became fools" (Rom. 1:22 ESV). So, by God's grace, let us humbly trust Him and His Holy Word!

## b. People in general:

- i. Misplaced trust We all trust in some thing or someone; the Bible says, "Whoever trusts in his own mind is a fool" (Prov. 28:26 ESV). We have God's Word and our own minds; though we are tempted to trust in us, let us trust in God and His Word!
- ii. Poor planning For the man in Luke 12 who planned his earthly life, but had no plans for eternity, "God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" (Luke 12:20 ESV). Since our days will eventually come to an end, let us be and remain ready for God's call by continuing to hold fast to Jesus!
- iii. Slow to believe God's Word The OT made it clear that the Messiah would rise from the dead, and Jesus spoke of it multiple times. But on that first Easter Sunday, some of His followers were struggling to believe, so Jesus "said to them, 'O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have

- spoken!" (Lk. 24:25 ESV). Why were they foolish? Even though God is holy—so He cannot lie and even though God is almighty in power—so He can do whatever He says, they were slow to believe!
- iv. No action In His sermon on the mount, Jesus gave wonderful instructions to His disciples; He taught such things so that disciples would put them into practice. For those who do, Jesus calls them wise; but He also said that "...everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand" (Matt. 7:26 ESV). So, rejoicing in the Gospel, let us do the Word!
- v. Unwilling to embrace the cross The Bible teaches that God became a man in order to die on a cross to save people who despise Him. What do you think incomprehensible love or unbelievable foolishness? The Bible says that "the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor. 1:18 NAS). We are not called to understand God's ways, but we are called to repent and believe!

**Conclusion:** Let us pray: Dear Father in heaven, You love us and have bought us back; please keep us from being fools and keep us ever-holding fast to Jesus! In His name, we pray!
