

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This sermon is part 1 in a new series I am calling, Are You Ready to Cross the Finish Line? Why such a title? As we think about the world in which we live, God *created it, *is continuing it, and *will eventually bring it to an end. When will that happen? No person knows the date, but many things should be catching our attention:

- Jesus basically said: As people were unprepared when the flood came, so they will be unprepared when I return (Mt. 24:37-39). Do most seem unprepared?
- The Bible says: 2 Timothy 3:1-4 "...in the last days...
 men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful,
 arrogant, revilers [users of abusive language], disobedient
 to parents, ungrateful, unholy, unloving, irreconcilable,
 malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of
 good, treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of
 pleasure rather than lovers of God..." // Years ago, such
 people were few; today, such people are many!
- The Bible says: 1 Thessalonians 5:2-3 "...the day of the Lord will come [unexpectedly] just like a thief in the

night. While they are saying, 'Peace and safety!' then destruction will come upon them suddenly..." // Most today are *unaware, *uninterested, and *unprepared.

In this first sermon of the series, we are focusing on some **highlights** and **lowlights** from Genesis 1:1-6:8.

- 1. Creation and Perfection (Genesis 1-2): Those two words correspond with Genesis chapters 1 and 2. In six days, God created the heavens, the earth, and all that is in them; everything was perfect *vegetation on the dry ground, *light sources in the sky, *fish in the sea, *birds in the air, *animals and people on the dry land, and ©no death, ©no mourning, ©no crying, ©no weeds, ©no pain!
- 2. Fall and Consequences (Genesis 3): Very shortly after God created Adam and Eve, and before they followed God's command to be fruitful and multiply, they were tempted by Satan and fell into sin. Their sin brought ▶immediate spiritual death, ▶much pain and trouble, and ▶eventual physical death. God's perfect world was ruined for ⊜all people, ⊜all animals, and ⊜nature itself.
- 3. Promise and Sacrifice (Genesis 3): God told Satan, that great fallen angel and deceiver: A great future descendant of the woman will come (the Messiah) and you will inflict much pain upon Him, BUT He will destroy you (15)! Then, to cover the nakedness of Adam and Eve, God sacrificed an animal, which pointed ahead to Jesus offering Himself as the perfect sacrifice, to clothe us with His righteousness!
- 4. Murder and Mercy (Genesis 4): God blessed Adam and Eve with a son named Cain; then Eve, expressing her faith in God's promise, said, "I have gotten a man, the Lord with the help of the LORD" (1). Her faith was right looking for

the Messiah, but Cain was not the Savior. Then Eve had a second son named Abel. In time they both offered a sacrifice to God; "the language implies that the offerings were accompanied by prayer requests, and that Abel received that for which he prayed but Cain did not" (TLSB). Then Cain murdered his brother. Even though Cain expressed no sorrow, the Lord showed mercy to Cain by putting a mark on him so that others would not kill him.

5. Descendants of Cain and Seth (Genesis 4-5):

- a. Cain married one of his sisters, a practice which was not prohibited by God until the time of Moses about 2,500 years later. Then, through a brief genealogy, we come to Cain's great great-grandson Lamech; he took two wives; then, later, he bragged to them, "I have killed a man for wounding me; And a boy for striking me" (23). Sin was increasing more and more!
- b. Adam and Eve had another son named Seth, the line through whom the Messiah would come. Then Seth had a son named Enosh. At that time, people "began to call upon the name of the LORD" (26) worshiping, praying, and preaching about the coming of the Savior!
- c. The descendants of Cain were *generally* **UNBELIEVERS** (4:17-24), while those of Seth *generally* **BELIEVED God's promise to send the Messiah** (5:1-32), and included famous people, such as <u>Enoch</u> *taken to heaven* without dying (24) and <u>Methuselah</u> who lived to be 969 years old and was the grandfather of Noah (27-29).
- 6. Thoroughness of Wickedness (Genesis 6:1-8): Sin began with Adam and Eve eating the forbidden fruit; then Cain murdering Abel; then Lamech murdering two people. Then, in Genesis 6, sin had a HUGE GROWTH SPURT!

- a. <u>Mixed marriages</u>: The <u>sons of God</u> (*believers*) married the <u>daughters of men</u> (*unbelievers*).
- b. <u>Falling away</u>: God created people to be in relationship with Him, *yet by that time in history*, the LORD said that most people had become **mere flesh** *focusing only on the things of this world* (**much like today**).
- c. <u>The Nephilim</u>: They were mighty men *in a sense*, yet they were "tyrants…, sinners ripe for judgment in God's eyes" (TLSB) (like the mighty men in the world today).
- d. The LORD's assessment: "...the wickedness of man was great on the earth, and... every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (5).
- e. The LORD's decision: "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, from man to animals to creeping things and to birds of the sky; for I am sorry that I have made them.' But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD" (7-8).

Conclusion: Unbelief and wickedness never turn out well, so the LORD is calling everyone to repent now and be ready to cross the finish line – before it is too late!

- <u>Truth</u> God is powerful creating, and merciful saving!
- Relevance Since the end is coming, stay close to Jesus!
- Inspiration Since most are focusing on this world, let us seize our opportunities to point them to Jesus!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, since the world seems ripe for judgment, keep us in Jesus and use us to warn others that the finish line is drawing closer and closer!

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
