

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This is part 3 of the series: Are You Ready to Cross the Finish Line? The finish line refers to \*your own death OR \*the return of Jesus. Those who are ready to cross are living in repentance, so they are acknowledging sin, hell, and helplessness, and aliving with sorrow for sin and trust in Jesus for eternal life!

So far in this series we have learned how the world went from perfection to sin; then, on that very day, the Messiah was promised♥! A proper response would have been sorrow, trust, and joy, BUT the actual response was wickedness. So, many years later, the LORD caused the worldwide flood !

After the HORRIBLE FLOOD, we would expect ongoing sorrow, trust, and obedience, BUT, instead, the OT Scriptures tell us about more sin, narrowing, and signposts.

✓ More sin: For example: Noah planted a vineyard and got drunk, the people refused to fill the earth, and Terah, the father of Abram, worshiped false gods (Josh. 24:2), BUT the LORD did not forget His promise♥!

- ✓ <u>Narrowing</u>: The LORD first promised the Messiah in Eden, then, about 2,000 years later, "the LORD said to Abram... 'in you all the families of the earth will be blessed'" (Ge. 12:1, 3). Meaning, the Messiah will eventually come into the world through your family.
- ✓ <u>Signposts</u>: Then, for the next 2,000 years, God erected many signposts, which pointed ahead to the coming Messiah! <u>This sermon will identify some of those signs</u>.
- Isaac's Replacement: NAU Genesis 22:7-9 Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said... "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?"
   Abraham said, "God will provide..." [then—with a ram; and later—with His only Son] ... Abraham... bound his son Isaac... // Isaac's willingness to be bound pointed ahead to Jesus' willingness: "not My will, but Yours be done" (Luke 22:42).
- 2. Jacob's Fourth Son: Judah; he spoke up to spare the physical life of his brother Joseph (Gen. 37:26), pointing ahead to us being spared eternally through the Messiah. Also, Jacob, before he died, said of Judah, "Your father's sons shall bow down to you" (Gen. 49:8), indicating that of his twelve sons, the Messiah would come through Judah!
- 3. The Passover: When it came time for the descendants of Jacob/Israel to leave their slavery in Egypt, the LORD caused ten plagues to show His power over the false gods of the Egyptians. Plague ten, involving the blood of unblemished male lambs, pointed so clearly to Jesus, the Lamb of God, who, in dying for us, set us free eternally!
- 4. The Sacrifices: God commanded the sacrifices through Moses in Leviticus chapters 1-7; why? To †make the

- people sorry for their sins <u>and</u> tkeep pointing them to the coming Messiah and His ultimate, *all-sufficient sacrifice!*
- 5. The Sabbath Day and Festivals: The weekly sabbath and the seven annual festivals are explained in Leviticus chapter 23. Each day of rest pointed ahead to the Messiah, our ultimate rest (Heb. 4)! The four spring festivals pointed ahead to the Messiah's first coming, the three fall festivals pointed ahead to His second coming!
- 6. Joshua and Jesus: After Moses, Joshua led the twelve tribes of Jacob/Israel into the Promised Land. Why is that significant? (1) The names Joshua and Jesus are the same: ⇒Yeshua (Hebrew) to English is Joshua; ⇒Yeshua to Greek is Ἰησοῦς; ⇒Ἰησοῦς to English is Jesus. (2) Joshua leading into the Promised Land pointed ahead to Jesus leading all repentant ones into heaven the ultimate Promised Land!
- 7. Samson (Judges 13 16): His life pointed ahead to the Messiah; for example: ▶at times the Spirit of the LORD came upon Samson mightily, and pointed to the Messiah who said, "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD IS UPON ME" (Lk. 4:18); ▶Samson was a God-appointed judge, pointing to Jesus who has been appointed by God to judge the living and the dead; and ▶Samson's defeat of the Philistines, pointed ahead to the Messiah's defeat of our greatest enemies!
- 8. David: Joseph (thru Solomon, Mt. 1), Mary (thru Nathan, Lk. 3), and Jesus were David's descendants. The LORD said thru Jeremiah, "I will raise up for David a righteous Branch; And He will reign as king (Jer. 23:5). When it seemed impossible, the LORD enabled David to defeat Goliath, the 9'-6" Philistine warrior, which pointed ahead to Jesus, the meek Son of God, defeating sin, death, and the devil!

- 9. Isaiah 53: The chapter points ahead to Jesus, the Suffering Servant: †His appearance would not attract us, †He would be despised [hated], †He would be pierced for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities, and †He would be cut off from the land of the living, YET He would ©justify the many and ©intercede for the transgressors!
- 10. The Angel of the LORD: He is the very Son of God, so He is Jesus before He put on flesh! He is mentioned about 50 times in the OT; for example: →He stopped Abraham from sacrificing Isaac (Gen. 22); →He stopped Balaam from cursing the descendants of Israel (Num. 22); →He brought the Israelites into the Promised Land (Judges 2); →He won a great victory through Gideon (Judges 6-7); →He appeared to the parents of Samson (Judges 13); and →He struck down 185,000 Assyrian solders (2 Kings 18-19)! Since Jesus had to be a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Judah, David, etc., the Angel of the LORD sustained that family line so, at the right time, He could become the Messiah!

## Conclusion:

- Truth During the OT, God kept pointing to the Messiah!
- Relevance The Messiah came to remove all sins!
- <u>Inspiration</u> All repentant ones will rejoice in heaven!
