

Then Jesus sat down and taught the people from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He told Simon, "Take the boat out where the water is deep, and let down your nets for a catch."

"Master," Simon answered, "we worked hard all night and caught nothing. But if You tell me to, I will let down the nets."

When the men had done this, they caught a very large number of fish, and their nets began to tear. So they waved to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. They came, and they filled both boats so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell down at Jesus's knees. "Leave me, Lord," he said. "I am a sinful man."
