Job 19:23-27

A. Summary of the Book of *Job*: Chapters 1 & 2; 3—31; 32—37; 38—41; 42

B. The Greatness of Job's Faith—Job 2:10c; Ezekiel 14:14: Noah, Daniel, Job

C. James 5:7, 10: The PATIENCE/ENDURANCE of Job / Job 19:7: Job cries for "justice"

D. Job's Speaks of CHRIST'S RESURRECTION — and His Own Resurrection — 19:23-27

Oh how I wish my words were written:

I wish they were inscribed on a scroll,

or engraved on rock,

or on lead with an iron stylus. [SO THEY WOULD LAST!]

I know my Redeemer/Vindicator lives [Incarnation]

and will <u>at last</u> stand <u>on the dust</u> [during His *substitutionary* earthly ministry?].

Afterward my skin will surround this body,

and in my flesh I will see God,

whom I myself will see,

my eyes will see **ONE** who is *not* a stranger.

I Job's Life Compared to That of Christ:

1. The humiliation of Job & Jesus

- a. Job 1:6—2:8: Job loses everything—all his wealth and his ten sons & daughters
- **b.** 2 Cor. 8:9: "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ—He was rich, yet for you He became poor in order to make you rich through His poverty.

2. Satan tempted Job & Jesus

- **a.** Job 2:6: "You may do what you like with him," the LORD told Satan.
- **b.** Matt. 4:1: Then the Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

NOTE: Compare Job 2:10c with 1 Peter 2:22!

3. The friends of Job & Jesus forsook both of them

- a. Job 19:13-19
 - (selected): "My brothers have left me; my friends are complete strangers to me. My relatives and closest friends have stopped coming; the guests in my home have forgotten me. My wife loathes my breath; I stink to my own family. All my intimate friends are disgusted with me; those I love have turned against me.
- **b.** Matt. 26:56b: Then all the disciples left Him and ran away.

4. Both Job & Christ suffered terribly, each being "unrecognizable

- a. Job 2:7, 8: Satan went away from the LORD and struck Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot to the top of his head. 8 Job took a piece of a broken pottery to scrape himself as he sat in the ashes.
- **b.** Matt. 26:38a: Then Jesus said to them, "My soul is so full of sorrow that I am at the point of death."
- c. Job 2:12: [...his three friends] did not recognize him.
- **d.** Is. 52:14: His [Christ's] appearance was more disfigured than any man and His form more than any human being.

5. Job & Jesus both felt forsaken by God the Father

- a. Job 13:24: "Why do You hide Your face and think of me as Your enemy?"
- b. Matt. 27:46: About three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying,
 "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, My God, why did You forsake Me?"

6. God returned both to Job & to His own Son

- a. Job 38:1: Then the LORD answered Job out of the storm:
- **b.** Lk. 23:46a: And Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Father, into Your hands I entrust My spirit."

7. Death touches both Job & Jesus Christ

- a. Job 30:23a: "Surely I know You will turn me over to death,...."
- b. Lk. 23:46b: After He said this, He died.

8. Both Job & Jesus are raised up after their sufferings

- a. Job 42:12, 16: The LORD blessed the last years of Job more than the first.... Job lived after that 140 years and saw his children, grandchildren, and greatgrandchildren. [Think: Job 19:25-27 also.]
- **b.** Rev. 11:15: "The kingdom of the world has become the Kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ, and He [Christ] will rule as King forever and ever."
