Third Sunday of Easter – 2023

Text: 1 Peter 1:17-25 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Last week we began Peter's first letter – discovering that he wrote to Jewish Christians who \*had been scattered and \*were living in Asia Minor – the area we know today as Turkey.

Peter wrote about our **amazing eternal inheritance** – the inheritance that is ours through our Spirit-given trust in Jesus! He also told us that trials may be permitted into our lives.

Why? **To prove our trust in Jesus to be genuine** – which is very important to know with absolute certainty!

**Today**, as we continue in **1 Peter chapter 1**, Peter will tell us the HUGE reasons why **we believers** should ▶ respect God and ▶ sincerely love other believers. Then, knowing such things, let us <u>greatly respect</u> and <u>greatly love</u>!

## 1. Why Believers Should Respect God:

a. The precious blood of Christ: <sup>17</sup> If you address as Father the One who impartially judges according to

each one's work [in other words, if your trust is in Jesus for eternal life and God is your Father, then], conduct yourselves in fear [with respect, reverence, and awe] during the time of your [temporary] stay on earth; [Why?] 18 knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, 19 but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, the blood of Christ. // The precious blood of Christ – have you thought about it?

- i. <u>Coverings for Adam and Eve</u>: Genesis 3 animal blood was shed to provide skin coverings.
- ii. <u>The first Passover</u>: Exodus 11-12 lamb blood was shed to spare the firstborn men from death.
- iii. The Passover Meals from Moses to Jesus: A period of about 1400 years and killing possibly 200,000+ lambs per annual celebration. So, how many lambs shed their blood during those years? Maybe 280 million+! Every drop of blood of every lamb was pointing ahead to Jesus, The Lamb of God, who was sent by the Father, to take away the sin of the world − including yours and mine!
- iv. The precious blood of Christ: The very Son of God in human flesh → †living in our place, †shedding His blood, and †suffering our eternal penalty to → free us from sin and death and → provide the gifts of forgiveness and eternal life!
- b. The monumental plan of God: <sup>20</sup> For [Christ] was foreknown before the foundation of the world [that is, before the Son of God created the world], but has appeared

in these last times for the sake of you <sup>21</sup> who through [Christ] are believers in God [the Father], who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God [the Father].

- i. Even before creation, God knew about the fall into sin and planned to send the Christ.
- ii. At the right time, the Son of God put on human flesh for our eternal benefit.
- iii. Now, by the work of the HS, we believe in Jesus and in God the Father who raised Jesus.
- iv. Significant believing differences:
  - 1. Some say, "I believe in God," but what does that mean that some generic God exists?
  - We have been blessed to understand that \*the LORD is our Father, \*our Lord is Jesus His Son, and \*the Spirit has made such things known, then He established and maintains our relationship with the Father and His Son.

Thinking about → who God is and → what He has done, let us give Him the highest ❤ respect, ❤ honor, ❤ trust, and ❤ obedience!

## 2. Why Believers Should Sincerely Love Each Other:

a. An eternal connection: That is what believers have with each other; all believers \*are alive in Christ, \*are members of the one body of Christ, and \*are seeking to know and be obedient to God's word. With those things in mind, this is what Peter wrote: <sup>22</sup> Since you [believers] have in obedience to the truth purified your souls for a sincere love [φιλαδελφία – that is, a genuine brotherly love] of the brethren, fervently [eagerly, earnestly] love one another from the heart [from deep within (not on the surface)], <sup>23</sup> for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable [like our earthly lives] but imperishable [eternal], ...through the living and enduring word of God. // Here we are, \*believers in Jesus – saved, forgiven, \*in possession of eternal life, and \*united together in one holy family with all other believers. What should we do? We should ©pay attention to our brothers and sisters in Christ, ©see their needs, and ©eagerly show them genuine love in word and deed!

b. The eternal word: <sup>24</sup> For, "ALL FLESH IS LIKE GRASS, AND ALL ITS GLORY LIKE THE FLOWER OF GRASS. THE GRASS WITHERS, AND THE FLOWER FALLS OFF, <sup>25</sup> BUT THE WORD OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER." And this is the word which was preached to you. // Since • God's word is eternal and • the Holy Spirit has worked through it to give us eternal life and unite us to God's holy family, let us ✓ recognize what the Spirit has done for us and ✓ gladly continue in that forever word of God → □ reading it, □ studying it, □ living it, and □ sharing it!
