NT LETTER (Epistle): Romans 14:1-12 NET

¹Welcome the person who is weak in the faith, but do not argue about different opinions. ²One person believes he can eat anything; another person whose faith is weak eats only vegetables. ³ Let there be no despising of the person who does not eat by the one who does eat. And let there be no criticism of the one who eats by the one who does not eat, because God has accepted that person. ⁴Who are you to criticize someone else's servant? It is a matter for his lord to determine whether he succeeds or fails. And he will succeed, because the Lord can make him succeed.

⁵One person thinks one day is better than the other; another thinks they are all alike. Let everyone be thoroughly convinced in his own mind. ⁶The person who has a special day means to honor the Lord. The person who eats does it for the Lord since he thanks God. 

SERMON AND SCRIPTURE READING:

²¹Then Peter came to Jesus and asked Him, "Lord, how often shall I forgive my brother who sins against me? Seven times?"

²²Jesus answered him, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy times seven times.

²³"That is why the Kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his slaves. ²⁴When he began to do so, there was brought to him one who owed him ten thousand talents [\$10,000.00]. ²⁵When this slave could not pay the debt, the master ordered him, his wife, his children, and all he had to be sold in order to settle the account. ²⁶Then the slave fell on his knees and, bowing low before him, begged: 'Be patient with me, and I will repay you everything!'
